


Increased poverty concerns from the effects of devaluation, scarcity of fuel and a lack of foreign exchange.

We are increasingly concerned that the communities that we are working with are being badly affected by these issues. Malawi is now the third poorest country in the world.

On 27th May 2022, the Malawian Kwacha had devalued by 25% as Malawi had to align the exchange rate to reflect the value of the kwacha vis-à-vis demand and supply dynamics at that time. It is now extremely sad to hear that there are fresh calls for another round of devaluation. This will lead to further increases in food prices in a country where there is much poverty.

An estimated 3.8 million people in Malawi are facing severe acute food insecurity. The situation is projected to continue to worsen because of high food prices, the depletion of food stocks, and the lean season (November–March). Shortages in fuel and basic items and a further increase in the prices of both, as a result of soaring inflation, are expected to continue affecting living standards.



There are now long queues at fuel stations across Malawi as the government is still struggling to resolve a longstanding foreign exchange shortage. Many fuel stations have no fuel and some only have diesel. This nationwide shortage of fuel is affecting work, businesses, domestic activities and is
