BIBLE EXPLORER REPORT 2020

Bible Explorer is an education programme aimed at providing understanding of the Bible in timeline sequence of both Old and New Testaments. The Bible Explorer team provide weekly lessons as part of Bible Knowledge or religious studies in primary schools. Bible Explorer also focuses much on quality delivery of lessons through accurate hand signs and clear communication of Bible stories in Standards 5 and 6 in local primary schools in Malawi with the objective of bringing God's Kingdom into the lives of children. It is for all faiths.

IMPACT OF CORONA VIRUS PANDEMIC

The COVID 19 pandemic has negatively affected many schools that Bible Explorer visits. In Malawi schools were closed in March 2020 as a precautionary measure. The school session resumed in October 2020 with regulations to adhere to involving wearing of facemasks and use of hand sanitizers. Some classes were split into a number of streams translating into having longer teaching days in the schools with the highest enrolment.

During the first two weeks of October numbers of absenteeism were high, as some could not afford buying a facemask. However, the enrolment figures normalised in the third week.

So in the wake of the pandemic and school closures, the Bible Explorer team did not have active teaching in classes, instead, the office was working in shifts as directed by the Malawi government. This meant that the team was assisting with the managing of the central library in turns and it could remain open. Only borrowers were allowed to come to take and return books, often used by various students including those studying theology. The team were also involved in the distribution of foot pump washstands that Starfish has been donating to markets, churches and schools. Furthermore, the team, once a month met together to revise on teaching methodologies and sharing experiences to improve the programme. It was a thoughtful decision that the Country Director considered that the families of the Bible Explorers should not be affected but rather continue to maintain their salaries and work in the office despite the challenge of not going into schools.

BIBLE EXPLORER PROGRESS

So far, we are working with 52 Schools in Salima district and in nine zones namely Matenje, Chitala, Msalura, Ngolowindo, Ngodzi, Chipoka, Kaphatenga, Lifidzi and Katelera.

CASE STUDIES

Alice Madera, a girl and a standard 5 learner at Salima LEA Primary School commented that Bible Explorer has changed her life and now she is able to understand bible stories. She liked the story of Deborah.



"However, Covid 19 has affected our school and has lowered the education standards due to a long "holiday". Lastly, many learners dropped out of school as a result of the same long break, especially girl learners."

In addition, Bible Explorer has helped learners to grow spiritually as they learn about Jesus.
