CHERISH AND COURAGE ANNUAL REPORT FOR 2023.

BACKGROUND

Cherish and Courage are important programmes which help young people to make informed decisions during and after puberty. The Clubs meet once a week, during which the leaders teach Bible lessons, with chosen topics. The emphasis is on how much God loves the youths. The teaching also focuses on remaining pure in their Christian lives and refraining from indulging in immoral activities.

The programme commenced in 2017, and it targets adolescent young people from 9 to 16 years of age. Clubs are formed in various churches and currently there are a total of 18 clubs. Both Cherish and Courage have a total of 9 Clubs each. The 18 Clubs are led by a total of 18 volunteers. 9 ladies lead the girls Cherish Clubs and similarly 9 men lead the young men in the Courage Clubs. In total 84 girls and 35 boys attend these groups and are benefiting from the instruction and encouragement that they receive.

UPDATE ON PROGRESS

We conducted a 2 days training course for Cherish and Courage, at the training each club sent 2 representatives. The training was a success as the participants acquired skills and knowledge that will help them in there teaching. The training was facilitated by Delia Chirwa who is from Lilongwe.

After the training the leaders received book manuals that will help them with right information, and they will also help them draw a time frame for the programme.

At The Holy Ghost Temple, Assemblies of God, they have started teaching a new group of children as the old group had completed their studies. This is amazing news!

The impact has increased as the number of boys and girls at this club, who now have knowledge of the Word of God, has grown.

NEW RESOURCES PROVIDED

We received pencils, pens, books, soft cloth bags for the girls, games and cosmetics for women leaders, from Mission Direct. These materials were given to one centre which the Mission Direct team visited.

The resources will be of great use as they will help the children in their studies - for example the pens and books which they will be using at school.

CHALLENGES FACED IN THE PROGRAMME

The programme faces different challenges of which these are some:

- Failure to continue weekly meetings by the Leaders in other centres saying that they are busy with their individual schedules.
- Some young people have left the Centres because of other worldly activities which seem to be good. eg the cultural activities which are common in our society.
- Other Centres failed to start the activities because the young people are finding difficult to attend due to the school timetable which clashes with the Church planned time.
- In other Centres it has been the failure of the Church Leaders to own the programme.

We tried to visit the clubs that are facing these challenges, but it yielded nothing. A resolution was made to be continuing working with the active clubs.
