CHILDREN'S CLUB ANNUAL REPORT 2023

BACKGROUND

This programme is run for children from 4 to 16 years old. It is of great importance as the children enjoy different lessons from the Bible which helps them to make informed decisions based on biblical principles as they are growing up.

The programme started in 2006 and so far, there are 14 clubs in Salima District which are held weekly. At the meetings children play different games, which helps them to learn and to memorise Bible verses. In addition, we conduct monthly training for the volunteers who lead the clubs in order for them to understand their roles and gain knowledge themselves on various topics. Currently there are 36 volunteers and a total of 1,488 children benefiting from the programme.

Members of the club meet together every Friday, after classes finish. This ensures that no lessons are missed and benefits teachers and children alike. Despite the school being based in a Muslim community, children attend club activities in large numbers.
