CHERISH AND COURAGE REPORT

Cherish (for girls) and Courage (for boys) are programmes that target youth starting from nine to sixteen years although children over 16 years can also attend if they are not yet married. The programme establishes groups for both boys and girls to express issues that concern them including sexual relationships. The session are based on teaching from the Word of God to enable them to make helpful and safe decisions about their behaviour and life choices.

HOW IS THE PROGRAMME ORGANISED

The groups are led by trained men and women who enable the young people to freely share the issues they experience as they grow and to help them discuss what they need to know about their lives in the areas of sex, pregnancy, HIV and AIDS. Also, to reflect on the way God views them in contrast to the world's perception.

The groups are based in local churches which identify those who they feel would benefit from this training.

WHAT HAS TAKEN PLACE SO FAR

In readiness for the programme to resume after a break due to COVID, we have just conducted a two-day training for both Cherish and Courage. The training targeted volunteers from ten churches with each sending two participants - a man and a woman. We expected twenty people and out of this number eighteen turned up, the remaining failed from one church. The training was successfully conducted, and participants were given skills to lead and help these young people with relevant information and a manual. The churches running the programmes are Africa Methodist Episcopal, Emanuel Christian Pentecost, Winners Chapel International, Zambezi Evangelical, Pentecostal Holiness, New Samaritan, Church of Nazarene, Pillar of fire and Malawi Assemblies of God. The training was facilitated by YWAM volunteer, Delia Chirwa, from Lilongwe.

HOW LONG DO THE GROUPS RUN

The duration in which the boys and girls will work through the lessons depends on the one teaching them, but the maximum period can be up to six months. After which the leaders can identify another set of boys or girls and follow the same cycle. By the end of each set, the teacher will encourage the members to commit to follow through with the principles and the members can respond by promising to adhere to the guidance. The groups will continue to meet to encourage, support and provide accountability. The members are reassured by the leader that anything shared remains confidential within the group. Furthermore, leaders will make themselves available to discuss issues on a one to one basis if the members need that as part of their pastoral care within the church.
