SPONSORSHIP MID YEAR REPORT JULY 2023

BACKGROUND

The programme was introduced in 2005 in Salima and Kasungu districts, and it has been of great importance to many girls and boys who are orphans and those that come from vulnerable homes where the parents or guardians cannot manage to pay school fees for the children. Many have been helped with secondary education and others in tertiary education.

The programme has increased the number of sponsored students who are now in secondary as well as tertiary education, and we wish to express our deepest gratitude to all our sponsors for their steadfast support and generosity.

UPDATE ON PROGRESS

Currently we have 155 students in different secondary schools and 35 of our former secondary students are now at University, College or in Vocational Training throughout the country. Each year we are delighted to see some of our students graduate from college.

Many of our past sponsored students are now working in Government Departments and Non-governmental organizations (NGOs). Some are now qualified teachers, some nurses and even doctors, who have received support from their sponsor during the years of training. We have many that have started their own business too.

Students in secondary schools are given pens, notebooks pocket money and transport to school at the beginning of every term. They are also provided with a mosquito net, a torch, a scientific calculator, and an English dictionary, just to mention a few. Girls are also given reusable sanitary pads and knickers in order to reduce absenteeism when mensturating.

In May 2023, the UK team visited Malawi and many activities happened during the visit. One of them was the students meeting which was held on 27th May at Msalura Primary School in Salima where students had a chance to interact with the UK team. Students were advised, encouraged and motivated to work hard in school in order to achieve their goals.

There were speakers from both Malawi and UK and the students were given a chance to ask questions and to get clarification on different issues. In attendance were secondary school students and a few students from different Universities.

One of the tertiary students shared his education journey to encourage secondary school students that it is possible to make it through hard work and good behaviour. At the end of the meeting some students received gifts from their sponsors and girls also received reusable sanitary kits and knickers.

"After writing my standard 8 exams, I was selected to Lilongwe Girls Secondary School. At that point I was so worried because I thought it was the end of the road for my education because my parents could not afford to pay my school fees. But everything changed as Starfish introduced me to my sponsors who paid my school fees," explained Sauda Juwawo.

After finishing her education, Sauda was selected to Lilongwe University of Agriculture and Natural Resources (LUANAR), where Starfish continued to help her with pocket money.



Sauda also shared,

"In October last year, I graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Agriculture and I am now working as an intern at Salima District Council. Now I am able to provide for my family and pay fees for my younger siblings. Thank you to my wonderful sponsors and to Starfish."
